An initial relocation to a Bethesda office building immediately proved to be ill-fated as the studio space was inadequate and within a few months, MYB's long-time administrators resigned. The school faced closing permanently.

Thankfully, a new board came together to support Michelle Lees. This new board, led by Charlie Barnett together with several adult students, parents, and friends, searched and found our current location.
